28mm Wattle Fences

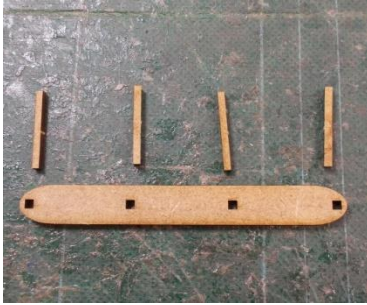
Please read these instructions fully before starting construction.

PVA or equivalent glue will be required to stick sections together.

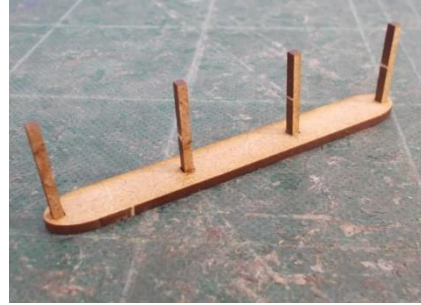
Sand paper can be used to gently clean any joints.

A sharp modelling knife will be required to remove sections from the sprue. Please use knives with due care and remember to cut away from yourself at all times.

During the construction of this model, you may find it convenient to use pegs / elastic bands to hold pieces in place while you allow glue to dry.



Take the base and four posts from the sprue.



Glue the posts to the base.



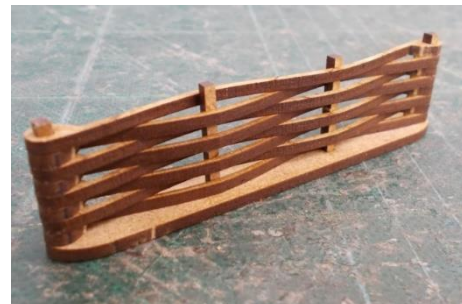
Take the eight wavy sections. The easiest way to remove them from the sprue (once you've cut the sprue points) is to gently push one end with a knife, then gently push the other end.



Slide one wavy section over the two end posts, ensuring it goes round the centre posts (see pic)



Turn a wavy piece over and slot it into place (see pic)



Continue until you have all eight pieces in place.

Painting

After construction we sprayed our fences black with a car undercoat then gave them a very rough coating of a dark brown chocolate colour. They then had a drybrush of a milk chocolate, followed by a dry brush of a cream colour.
